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Kona Coffee Cupping Competition Awards Arianna Farms 'Ono Kona Coffee LLC, Onila Farms and Castaway Bay Kona Coffee 2017 Winners

Kona, Hawaii (Updated 12/12/17)—Winners of the prestigious Kona Coffee Cupping Competition were selected from 76 judged entries during the 47thⁿ Annual Kona Coffee Cultural Festival. Arianna Farms 'Ono Kona Coffee LLC captured their first win in the Commercial Division; Castaway Bay Kona Coffee won in the Artisanal Division's Heritage Profile and Onila Farms captured the win in the Artisanal Division's Modern Profile.

New this year is the reimagined scoring system. Kona Coffee Cupping Competition organizers moved away from national blanket standards for judging coffee characteristics and moved towards a scoring system that established what characteristics were important for judging Kona coffee on its own as a region. Launched this year, two flavor profiles took the stage; Heritage Profile, a classic Kona coffee profile and Modern Profile, one that would be celebrated by modern, specialty coffee consumers. While both are quite valuable, one represents the legacy of Kona coffee while the other explores Kona coffee as a competitor on the international specialty coffee scene. Kona Coffee Cupping Competition organizers chose to use the classic profile for both divisions (commercial and artisanal) but inserted the modern profile in the artisanal division as well. Though two competitive divisions, Commercial and Artisanal, both divisions share common rules for entering the Kona Coffee Cupping Competition.

The organizers also determined the judges would use a 10 point intensity scale for measuring characteristics to define the profiles. The characteristics used in the 2017 Kona Coffee Cupping Competition were acidity, body, coffeeness, sweetness, floral, complexity and defects.

All coffee entered must be 100% Kona coffee, grown solely in the district of Kona on the island of Hawaii. State of Hawaii law requires that any coffee labeled as Kona coffee must be of grade Prime or better. All submissions are marked with an anonymous number for a true blind taste competition.

The prestigious two-day Kona Coffee Cupping Competition hosted an internationally recognized panel of cupping judges who evaluated 76 Kona coffee entries.

Shawn Steinman who oversaw the cupping competition as its new chair, is a coffee scientist, author, and consultant and also co-owner of Daylight Mind Coffee Company who hosted the two-day event at their oceanfront location in Kailua-Kona.

By Wednesday afternoon, the judges had narrowed the field of entries. In the Artisanal Division 10 farms advanced in the Heritage Profile; 10 farms in the Modern Profile and 5 in the Commercial Division all advanced to Thursday's finals.

"There's a wide range of profiles that we are tasting this year. We have more traditional coffees and we have a lot of dried, natural processed coffee that we are tasting as well, which is something that didn't exist here in Kona five or six years ago," said Kona Coffee Cupping Judge Andrew Hetzel.
