With hard work and dedication, the Kona Coffee Cultural Festival was born and Kona has been brewing with excitement every November since that celebrated start. Hawaii's oldest food festival continues to tell the story of Kona's rich coffee history and the cultural heritage that is the foundation of the Kona Coffee Cultural Festival.
